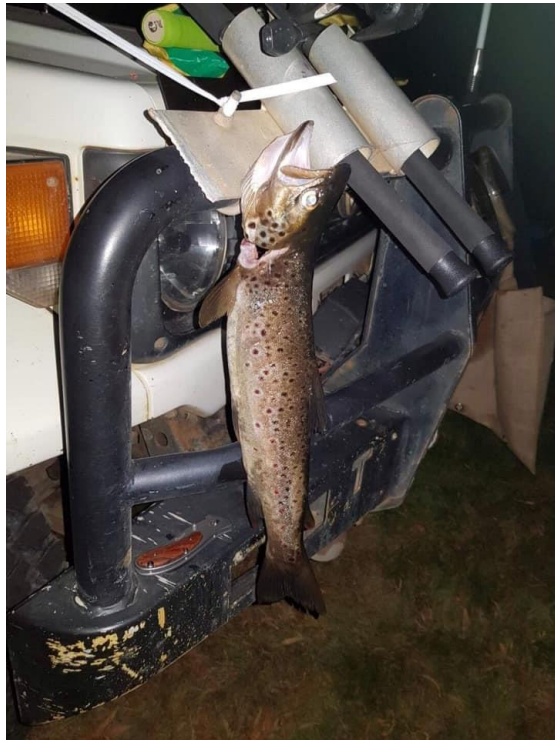

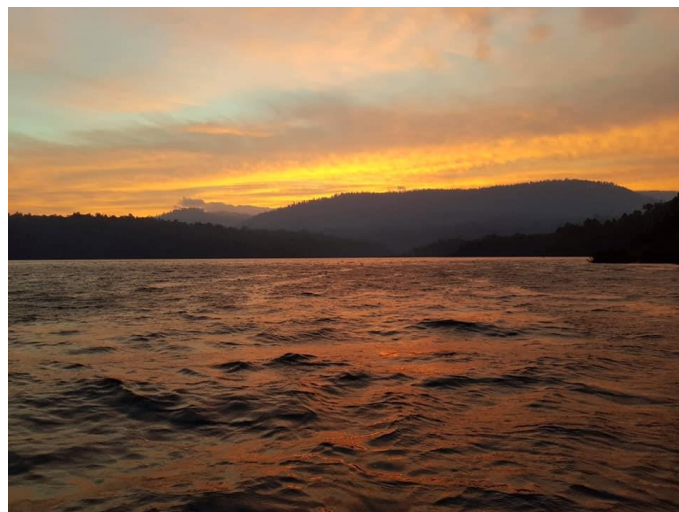
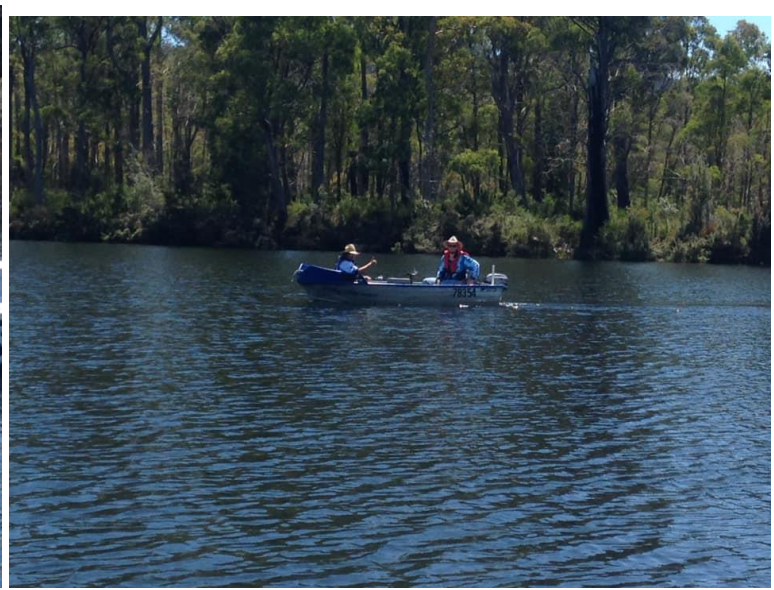

A BUSHFIRE WATCH AND ACT MESSAGE FOR MAYDENA, TYENNA, MOUNT FIELD AND NATIONAL PARK

Issued At: 25/01/2019 3:02pm

There is a bushfire at Gell River, Southwest.
This fire may put Maydena, Tyenna, Mount Field and National Park at risk Today .

The fire has crossed the Gordon River and is progressing South towards Adamsfield.
This fire may be difficult to control.
There may be embers, smoke and ash falling on Maydena, Tyenna, Mount Field and National Park.

What to do:
You need to start taking action now to protect your family and your home.
If you are not prepared for a bushfire, be ready to leave for a safer place.
If you don't live near Maydena, Tyenna, Mount Field and National Park, stay away.
If you are planning to travel to Strathgordon cancel your plans and stay away.
If your family have made a bushfire survival plan, use it now.
Keep updated by listening to ABC Local Radio or look at the TFS website at www.fire.tas.gov.au.

Community Information:
Gordon Rver Road at Styx Road intersection is closed to all traffic prohibiting access to Strathgordon.
Gordon River Road at Strathgordon will be closed at 4:00 pm for all traffic. If you are at Strathgordon and you want to leave you need to leave the area before the road closure.
Tasmania Parks and Wildlife Service (PWS) ask that **visitors do not commence bushwalks or four-wheel driving in remote areas until further notice.**

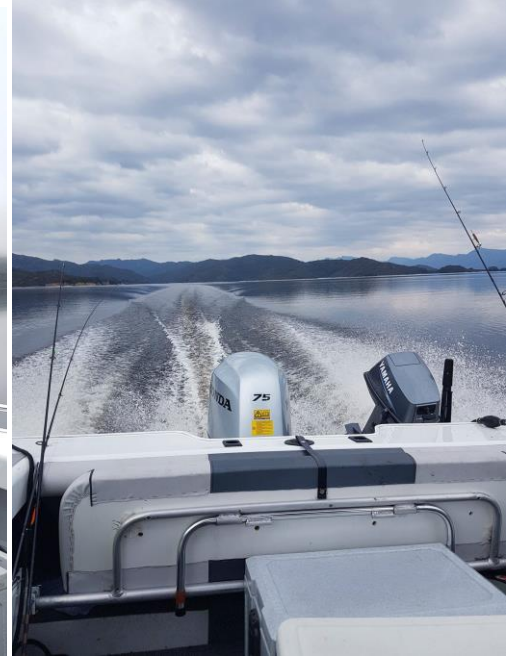

Recipe Corner

Smoked trout pate

Ingredients

350g hot smoked trout

250g cream cheese, softened

1 tbs lemon juice

1 tbs finely chopped capers

1 tbs chopped chives, plus extra, to garnish

2 tsp horseradish cream

olive oil spray

6 small tortillas

Method

1. Peel skin from trout and discard skin and bones. Process cream cheese in a small food processor with lemon juice, capers, chives and horseradish until smooth. Add trout meat and pulse until roughly chopped. Transfer to a serving bowl and chill.

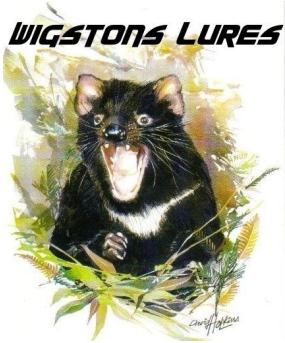
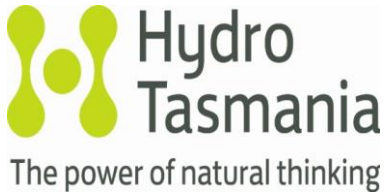
2. Preheat oven to 180°C. Spray both sides of tortillas with oil. Cut each into 8 triangles and spread on a baking tray. Bake for 15 minutes until crisp and golden. Sprinkle trout pâté with chives and serve with tortillas.

tip: This pâté can be made a day ahead, but only add the chives just before serving.

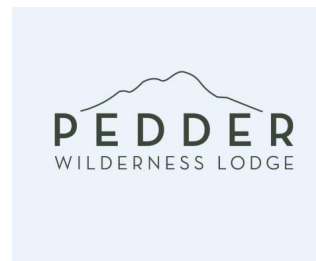
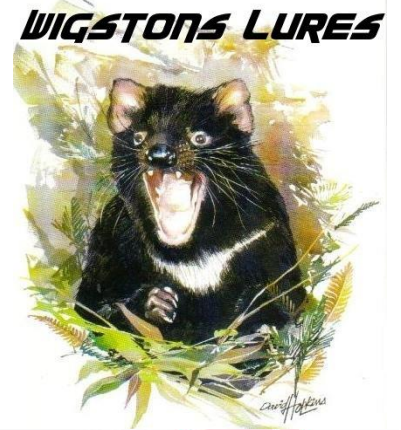
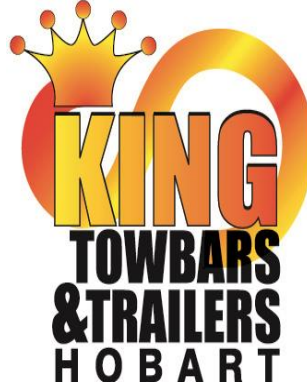
